PWD PROGRAMS



The intelligence community (IC) is committed to building an inclusive and diverse workforce and encourages applications from qualified individuals with disabilities. In 2015, the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency (NGA) established its efforts to support the IC goal by creating NGA's Persons with Disabilities (PWD) program. The PWD program was established with the intent to recruit qualified individuals with disabilities while fulfilling mission critical needs.

PWD Opportunities

Through PWD, individuals are able to support NGA's mission of delivering world-class geospatial intelligence, or GEOINT, providing a decisive advantage to policymakers, warfighters, intelligence professionals and first responders. Both an intelligence agency and combat-support agency, NGA enables the IC and Department of Defense to fulfill the president's national security priorities. Employees hired through the PWD program serve on support teams at U.S. military, diplomatic and allied locations around the world.

NGA continues its effort to recruit persons with disabilities through its annual Persons with Disabilities Showcase, consistently attending Wounded Warrior fairs, and various other efforts directed toward individuals with disabilities.



PWD PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Possess a Schedule A letter (physician certified) or be a veteran with a 30% disability rating or higher (supported by a VA letter)
- U.S. Citizen
- 18 Years of age or older
- Ability to obtain and retain a top secret security clearance
- Pass mandatory pre-employment drug screening
- Pass mandatory counterintelligence polygraph
